We invite applications for three tenure-track Faculty positions, two Assistant Professors and one Associate or Full Professor.

Responsibilities

The successful candidates will be expected to teach at the undergraduate and graduate levels, supervise Ph.D. and Master's students, pursue successful research programs, have a strong publication record, and contribute to the Department's activities. The research program of the successful applicants is expected to complement the work of other professors in the Department, in one of the following areas:

- exercise physiology,
- movement / behavioral neuroscience,
- biomechanics,
- physical activity promotion, health, and chronic disease prevention
- sport and health psychology,
- symptomatic / at risk populations (such as obesity, metabolic syndrome, adapted physical activities),
- exercise training and sports performance.

Requirements

- Ph.D. in kinesiology, exercise science, or an equivalent field,
- Experience in teaching / research in kinesiology, exercise science, or in a related field,
- An excellent publication record,
- Post-doctoral research training is an asset
- Proficiency in the French language *
